Despite growing literature on education and national unity, limited studies integrate national integration and social harmony within contemporary policy frameworks such as the National Education Policy (NEP), 2020. This gap indicates the need to examine how modern educational reforms can simultaneously strengthen national cohesion and promote inclusive social relationships. The National Education Policy (NEP), 2020 recognizes education as a transformative force for building an inclusive, equitable, and just society. By emphasizing constitutional values, critical thinking, cultural pluralism, and life skills, the policy envisions education as a means of bridging social divides and strengthening national integration.

By promoting inclusive practices and dialogue, educational experiences help students cultivate mutual respect and peaceful coexistence, thereby preparing them to function as responsible citizens in a multicultural society. In this way, education contributes to both personal character formation and collective social cohesion.
